Thanks must also go to Wee Jim and Louise, his daughter, for cutting the grass on the Kirk Greens.

Rain is not always welcome, but the plants have certainly benefited from it and are thriving. We are most grateful to Graeme Eldred, The Bike Station in the Station Square and Glenmuick Kirk for allowing ongoing access to water when required. Wendy and David Cobban, Peter and Jenny Hendry and Jo Coll are watering and weeding the various tubs when required, whilst Tommy and Colin are maintaining the beds. It is hoped to plant up the rear bed with perennials in the autumn to ensure a lovely display next year.

We hope this will bring some pleasure to you on your shopping trips and daily walks.

Wednesday 8th July should have seen us visiting the Cullen Community Allotment and the Walled Garden at Gordon Castle, Fochabers. Hopefully, we will be able to do this next year!

Sadly there will be no Flower Show for the village to enjoy and only time will tell if our meetings starting in November will go ahead. It's the same for the many groups in the village.

In the meantime, we can continue to work in and enjoy our gardens, and before too long, start planning for next year's plantings.
