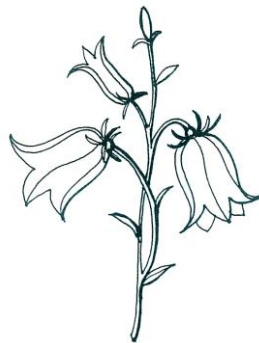

CONSTITUTION

I	The Society shall be named “Ballater Royal Horticultural Society”
II	<p>There are two tiers of annual membership, viz.,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full membership of £10 annually, which includes entry to all meetings and covers exhibiting at the Annual Exhibition • Affiliated membership of £5 annually, which covers exhibiting at the Annual Exhibition: however, attendance at any meetings will incur a £3 charge.
III	The management of the Society shall be vested in the Office-bearers and Committee to be chosen at the Annual General Meeting to be held on a Monday in October/November.
IV	The Chairman and the Treasurer shall give, at said Meeting, a correct statement of the Society’s affairs for the past year.
V	The funds of the Society shall be vested in the names of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary
VI	The Judges for the following year shall be chosen by the Committee at the first meeting after the show.
VII	Every member shall receive a Membership Card which shall admit him or her to the Exhibition.
VIII	The Prize Money shall be payable at the Annual General Meeting and the next meeting of the Society. Prize Money unclaimed after that shall be held as presented to the Society.
IX	<p style="text-align: center;">Terms of reference for the Floral Art Group</p> <p>(a) To establish a Floral Art group within the Society through meetings, demonstrations and workshops.</p> <p>(b) The group will be administered by its own Committee, be self-financing, and report with audited Accounts at the A.G.M. of the Society.</p> <p>(c) Members must join the Society, either as Full or Affiliated members. A representative shall sit on the Society Committee.</p>
X	No alteration or addition can be made to the Constitution unless by sanction of majority of the members present at the Annual General Meeting. Proposed alterations or additions must be handed in, in writing, to the Secretary 14 days previous to the Meeting.

RULES OF COMPETITION

(a)	The Competition is open to all persons complying with the rules.
(b)	All Competitors must be members of the Society and Subscriptions must be paid before the Annual Exhibition.
(c)	All articles presented for competition must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated, and must have been in his or her possession two months previous to the date of Exhibition.
(d)	Any infringement of Rule (c) shall lead to immediate disqualification and the exhibitor shall not be allowed to compete in any future Exhibition of the Society. <i>All complaints (signed by the complainant) must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within seven days after the Exhibition.</i>
(e)	Every exhibit intended for competition must have an Exhibition Card with the name of the Competitor on one side and the Class No. of the exhibit on the reverse. <i>Cards will be available from the Secretary or Mrs Julie Jarvis.</i>
(f)	Entries must be on the appropriate Forms provided in the Schedule and this must be in the Society's hands preferably THREE CLEAR DAYS before the Exhibition.
(g)	The Exhibition Room shall be open on the evening prior to the Show from 6.30pm to 9pm and from 7.30am to 9.15am on the day of the Exhibition, for the receipt of all exhibits intended for Competition. All exhibitors must be out of the Hall by 9.30am. Only exhibitors and Committee Members admitted to the Hall from 7.30am to 9.15am.
(h)	Competitors may present two exhibits only in each class, except where otherwise stated.
(i)	The number of prizes to be awarded in any class are at the Judges' discretion.
(j)	All exhibits are accepted at owner's sole risk.
(k)	The Society shall supply plates for vegetables and fruit (collections excepted) and no plates or other articles so supplied shall be removed from the Exhibition Room.
(l)	No exhibit shall be removed from the Exhibition Room before closing time on Sunday.
(m)	For the purpose of this Exhibition, a novice is a competitor who has not previously entered a class in that specific section.
(n)	In the event of a tie, the Cup or Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most 1 st points.
